



ITEM	UPDATE
Tropical Storm Elsa	While Alachua County volunteers were never deployed, several other counties, including Columbia County put hams to work. Brad Swartz N5CBP found volunteers for 3 shelters and worked about 36 hours straight as they grow their ARES group in Columbia County. There was some confusion about the Emergency net on Saturday morning which was reminiscent of disagreements that occurred last year. Section Emergency Coordinator Karl Martin will address.
Section ARES Net	Dave Daves has stepped down from Net Manager of the North Florida ARES net due to family needs. Arc Thames of far-west Santa Rosa county has volunteered and some significant changes are being contemplated, with lots of different ideas being proposed by section officials and others.
Currently BADGED ARES members	(When activated by the County, participants aren't "ARES" or any club, they are volunteers for the COUNTY, the authority having jurisdiction) Currently 20 badged volunteers who can be deployed, but several of these are county employees and will almost never be available for radio comms. We have 2-3 persons at or near the badging requirements and would be happy to help MORE
2021 ARRL National Conventi on Planning for service	Several of our local participants are now confirmed speakers at the EMCOMM forum provided by ARRL at HamCation 2022 National Convention; the date of the forums is Thursday Feb 10. Rick Palm K1CE and Gordon Gibby KX4Z have put together the topics. Both Alachua County and the local ARES participants have created planning documents known in FEMA-Speak as "Integrated Preparedness Plans," a new term since Jan 2020. On the radio end we have some 26 small projects spread over a 3-year planning time frame; the County prominently lists ARES over EIGHTY times in their comprehensive planning document.
Training	Local ARES participants continue to be active in weekly WINLINK training Susan Halbert, Vann Chesney, Leland Gallup, Barry Nason, Craig Fugate and occasionally Gordon Gibby. Alachua County continues to be a standout in this training program. Several of us have heard the wide-spectrum Cuban jamming on 40 meters, which appears to include the WINLINK space. However, 80 meters is wide open for data communications. The USA has 3 st party agreements with Cuba according to the ARRL so USA gateways can handle Cuban traffic.

Projects

We have more than 2 dozen local projects to increase preparedness. These are preparing for comms failures that we hope never happen. Brett Wallace will help get more people badged & work on FEMA category typing of radio volunteers; Leland Gallup will help get more volunteers who can deploy with HF as well as VHF/UHF; Gordon is tasked with helping more local groups/individuals get solar backup comms capability, seek ways to reach the public with authorities' bulletins, investigate how we might support the banking system and a few other items; Susan Halbert will work on surveying local ham repeaters whose owners are willing to allow authorities to use them in a dire emergency when the trunked system has been disabled; Jeff Capehart will help create a list of possible "loaner" transceivers to police/fire. Earl McDow is working on a list of possible locations for emergency high antennas; Lorilyn Roberts will address helping volunteers be able to stay on the air for up to 2 weeks despite scarcity of food, water, fuel; Earl Sloan volunteers to assist with antenna training. We still have projects needing additional volunteer leaders.

Infrastructure	The EOC backup radio station now has TWO working HF antennas and also a weather-protected coax switch thanks to David Huckstep. There is now a footswitch to help voice comms, three LIFEPO4 backup batteries in addition to about 7 lead-acid, and an adapter to allow either size headphone plug to be used with our HF radios. The solid-state amplifier's power supply is still out for repair so the vacuum tube amp is in service again. We are considering adding a federal VHF frequency at the EOC to allow encrypted communications to Shelters; this will take some time. The VHF/UHF radios that Larry Rovak picked continue to work extremely well for weekly SARNET EOC net training.
Extra Class Course	Date changed to the weekend in November JUST BEFORE Thanksgiving. Get your book and start reading now!
New Ham on the Air	New ham Lorilyn Roberts got a lot of help from David Huckstep and now has TWO working HF antennas and made it into the evening phone traffic net on 80 meters this week. She holds the Extra Class license but is working to gain more hands-on experience.
Nationwide talk	Florida volunteers are back in the news. Gordon Gibby will give a talk on Friday July 30 to the nationwide group of federal volunteers in the SHARES program about the Whirlwind Boom volunteer radio exercise completed on Friday March 19th, the largest backup radio exercise since at least 2013 in North Florida, that moved over 400 structured messages from simulated shelters in 8 counties to the State, and involved at least 85 volunteers. The goal is for other SHARES regions to carry out similar exercises that involve all radio volunteers, including federal, ARES, faithbased and others together in interoperability exercises.




